Reach University is our nation's only accredited nonprofit university fully dedicated to advancing on-the-job degrees, known as Apprenticeship Degrees.

We help districts address teacher shortages by building local talent pipelines. Our degree programs allow paraprofessionals, classroom aides, and other non-degreed staff to become fully certified teachers while continuing to work in your schools. Tuition for the BA is just \$75/month after scholarships and financial aid, with no financial obligation for employers. Classes meet online after work ours, and candidates receive college credit for work they do on-the-job.

Reach Liberal Studies Teaching Pathways

Reach's on-the-job Bachelor of Liberal Studies (BLS) program prepares undergrads to earn a debt-free bachelor's degree and prepare to become a classroom-ready teacher.

Step 1: Determine Pathway Based Upon College Credits



Designed for learners with 29 or less previous nonremedial college units/credits.

8 semesters, 4 phases



Designed for transfers with 30 previous nonremedial college units/credits.

6 semesters, 3 phases



Designed for associate degree holders across the arts and sciences.

4 semesters, 2 years

Culminates in a debt-free B.A. with a route to a teacher credential through Reach University's M.A.T. Program/Intern credential program, which is offered in partnership with Alternatives in Action*, or with a provider of your choice.







Step 2: Start the Reach Journey to a Debt-Free B.A.



- Blends practical application through job-embedded coursework.
- Coursework: Child development, differentiation in the digital age, and ethical practices in education.
- Develops leadership, critical thinking, literacy, and professional ethics skills.



Advanced Year(s)

- Candidates refine their expertise in science and literacy instruction.
- Coursework: Physical science, biology, and evidencebased literacy instruction through a combination of theoretical study and practical placement experience.
- Integrates critical pedagogy with credentialing preparation, creating readiness to enter a California preliminary credential program.



Intermediate Year

- Prepares candidates to develop effective instructional strategies.
- Coursework: Historical and mathematical concepts with methods for planning, curriculum design, and reflective practices.
- Equips candidates with the tools to implement best practices in complex educational settings.

Step 3: Take the Steps to a Teaching Credential



Reach's Intern* / Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.) Program Pathway:

- Post-graduation, enroll in the Intern/M.A.T. program (multiple and single subjects).
- Work as a Teacher of Record-making a teacher's salary!
- Dedicate about 10-15 hours/week.
- 1 to 2 years to California Preliminary Credential.



Teacher Credential Pathway:

- · Graduate from Reach University.
- Begin certification with Reach/AIA or your/the preferred provider of your K-12 LEA.
- 1 to 2 years to California Preliminary Credential.
